The modern Cypriot town of Polis Chrysochous lies above the city of Arsinoe and the earlier city-kingdom of Marion, whose archaeological excavation began in 1885. The Princeton Cyprus Expedition focuses on the remains of sanctuaries, public buildings, workshops, and private residences spanning the Geometric through Classical periods of Marion (ca. 900-300 BC) and the Hellenistic through Roman, early Christian, and medieval periods of Arsinoe (ca. 300 BC-1400 AD). Illustrated with 250 color photos of pottery, coins, jewelry, and figures, this book relates the discoveries establishing that these cities had close ties with Greece and with regions from Egypt to Anatolia. 359.
